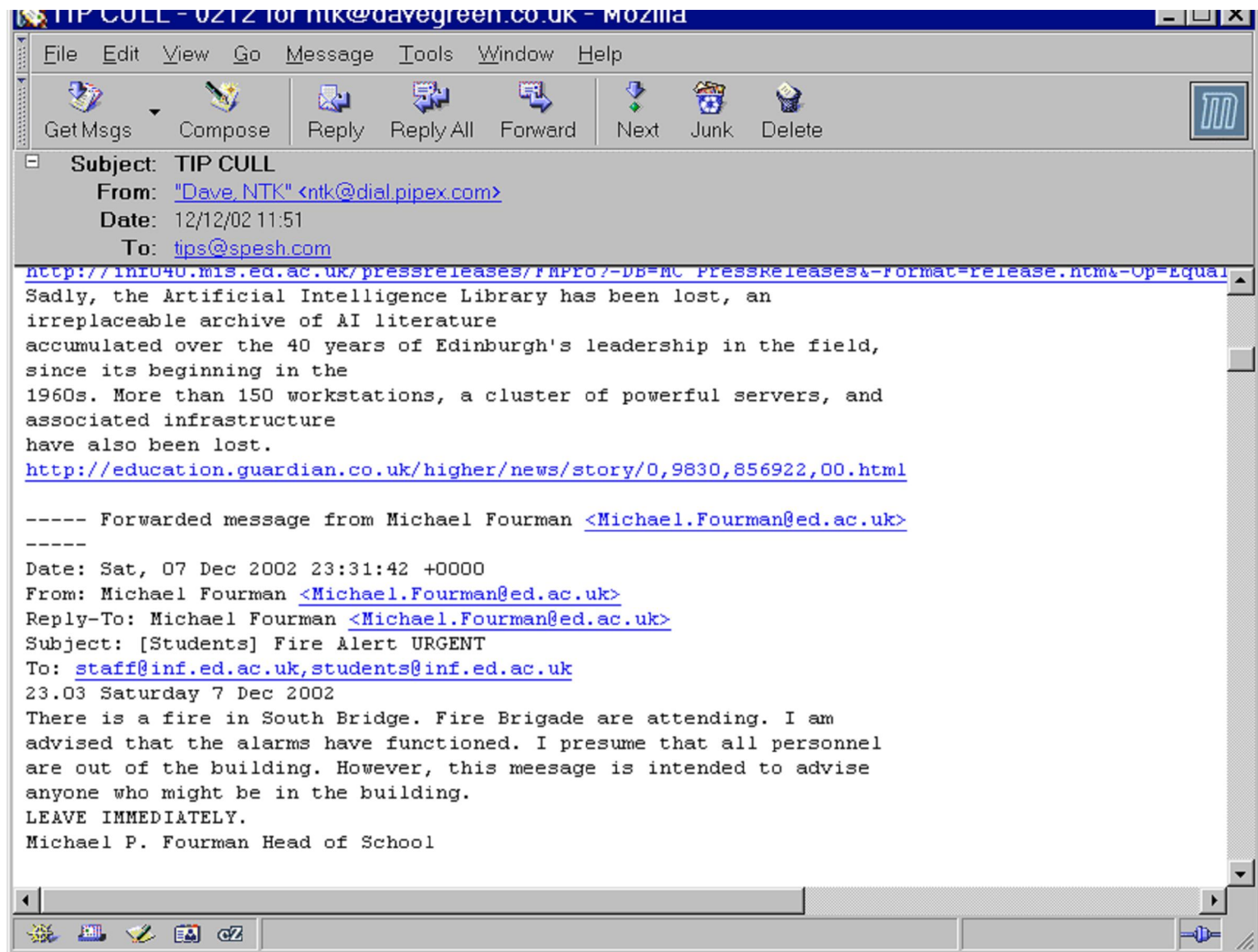



# CYBERDRUGS TO GIVE ADDICTS A FIX ON NET

TINY silicon chips implanted in the body could soon imitate the effects of heroin or cocaine.

The technology opens up the nightmare prospect of drug barons controlling victims with messages sent by internet to home computers.

The message would activate the chip, and deliver sensations to the brain identical to those created by drugs—and just as addictive.

An FBI crime conference in Germany was alerted to the danger of cyber-narcotics last week by agents from Britain's National Criminal Intelligence Service.

They said the Mafia had already bankrolled corrupt scientists to unleash the technology within 12 months.

Kevin Warwick, Professor of Cybernetics, at

Reading University, said: "Cyber space offers criminals opportunities to create unprecedented and terrible new forms of addiction. It would be easy to exploit."

The development will transform science-fiction into reality.

In the recent film Johnny Mnemonic, set in the year 2021, Keanu Reeves plays a courier who stores

information in a micro-chip in his head.

The new cyberdrugs—which would be implanted in the arm—could cause massive brain damage and psychological scarring.

And addicts would find themselves paying huge sums for a message to trigger their "fix."

## British hackers attack MoD satellite

### Satellite hijack 'impossible'



The latest Skynet satellite blasted off on Saturday

A senior defence industry analyst is contesting computer hackers' claims to have altered the course of one of the UK's military communications satellites.

Scotland Yard's Fraud Squad is investigating allegations of blackmail at several international locations after the hackers reportedly demanded a ransom payment to stop interfering with a Skynet satellite.

However, Paul Beaver, group spokesman for the Jane's Information Group, told BBC News Online: "I cannot see how it is possible for someone to hack in - it is a closed loop system, not connected to the Internet.

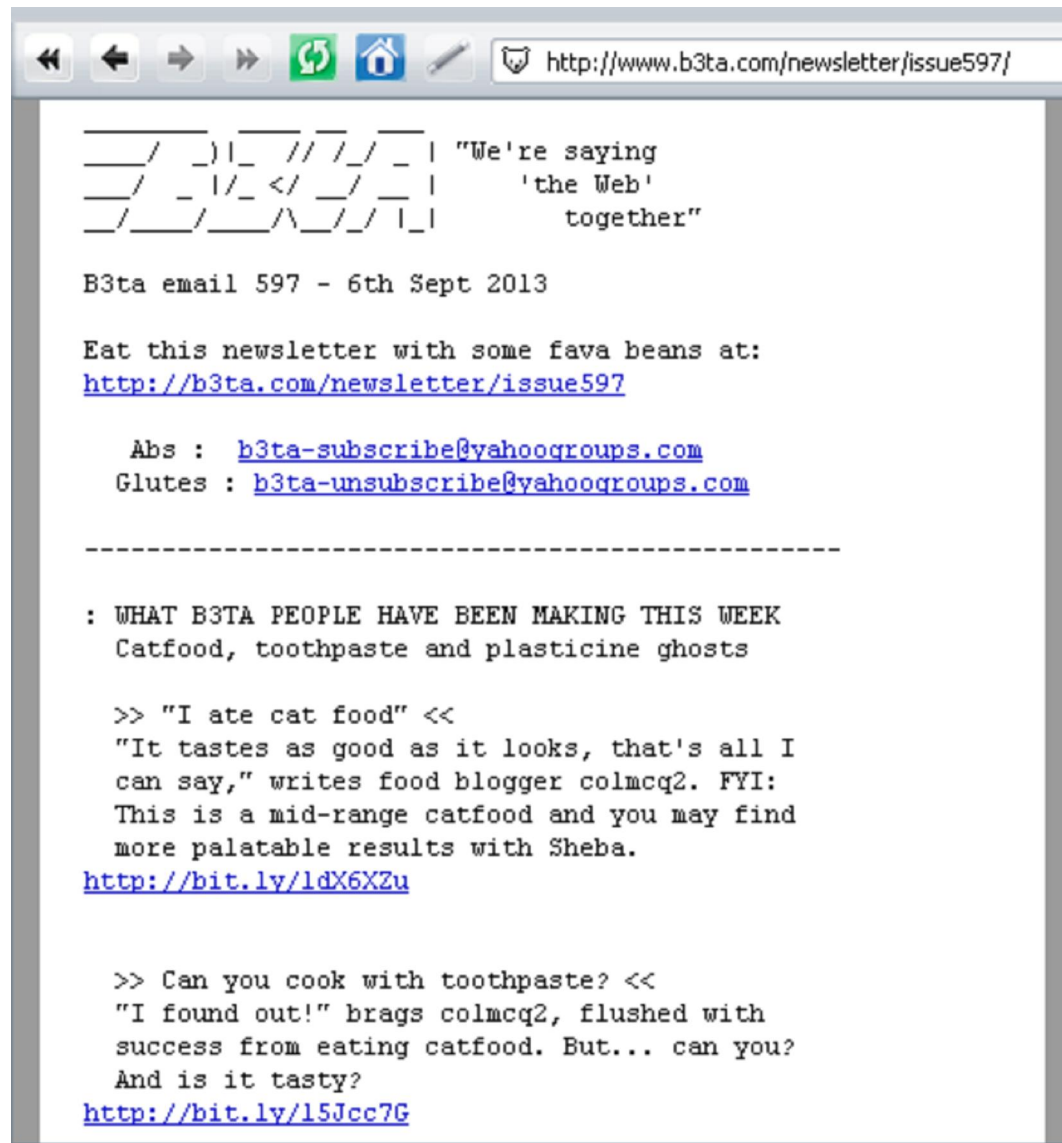

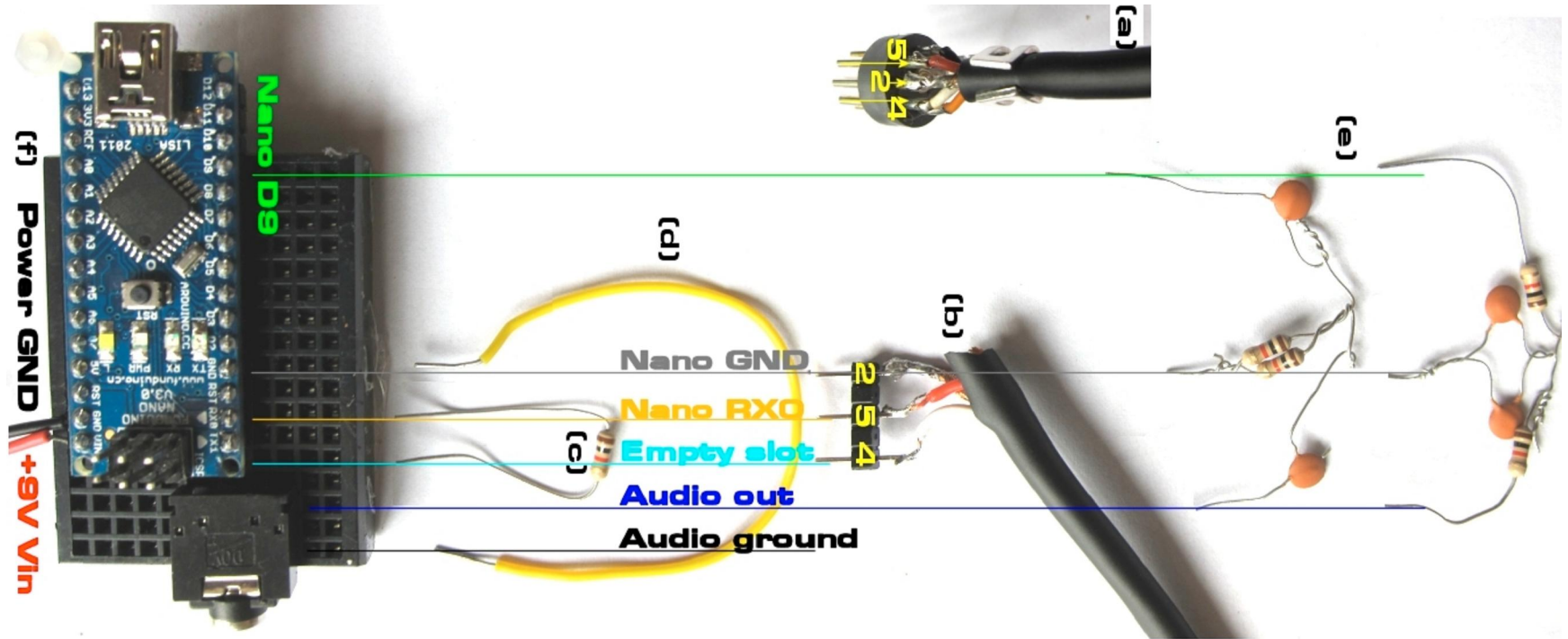
