Highlights of the year

- 1 online-only short form themed meeting (virtualUKNOF March 2022)
- 2 fully hybrid meetings UKNOF49 (Manchester, April) and UKNOF50 (London, September) remote and in-person speakers attendees were accommodated.
- Programme Committee refreshment. 50% of the current committee is new as of 2022, bringing new and diverse talent and perspectives.

The Programme Committee trialed UKNOF's first themed event - a panel session in a short form, online only virtualUKNOF. This proved to be a mild success and a second themed event is being considered.

The whole day UKNOF meetings in 2022 were fully hybrid and were a success. While hybrid, the ratio of remote-to-in-person participation for both speakers and attendees has mostly shifted back to in-person.

Plans for 2023

The Programme Committee plans to:

- Finalise an updated Programme Committee charter.
- Selection of a new Programme Committee Chair / renewal of new term of current Chair (dependent on finalising of the new charter).
- Continue to support remote presenters and attendees, but main focus will be on inperson content.
- Trial regular / recurring presentations, to provide the community with regular updates on what is happening in key areas of the industry (eg, policy and regulation).
